

How does it work

- Participatory process in 18 month cycles led by Trio Presidency that supports implementation of EU Youth Strategy
- Thematic priority of last cycle “Creating opportunity for Youth”
 - Quality Employment for All (RO)*
 - Quality Youth Work for All (FI)*
 - Opportunities for Rural Youth (HR)*
- *National consultations by National Working Groups – from April to October 2019 - EU Youth Conferences capture outcomes*
- *Next thematic priority (DE-PT-SI): Europe for YOUth - YOUth for Europe: Space for Democracy and Participation*



Diverse range of methods


- Pan European questionnaires

Diverse Participants

- 56,287 participants
- 60% male 39% female
- 10% identify as LGBTQ
- 13% identify as ethnic minority
- 13% identify as religious minority
- 5% identify as disabled


young people from all over the EU took part.
