


Context

Young people are **vital** for the Western Balkans.

BUT many challenges are persisting, in particular:

- lack of opportunities and skills mismatch
- high unemployment (22,7%, World Bank)
- brain drain

- enhancing digital skills and competences for the digital transformation


European Strategy for Universities












Total number of projects in which the country is involved as coordinator or partner



Features of selected projects 2023






