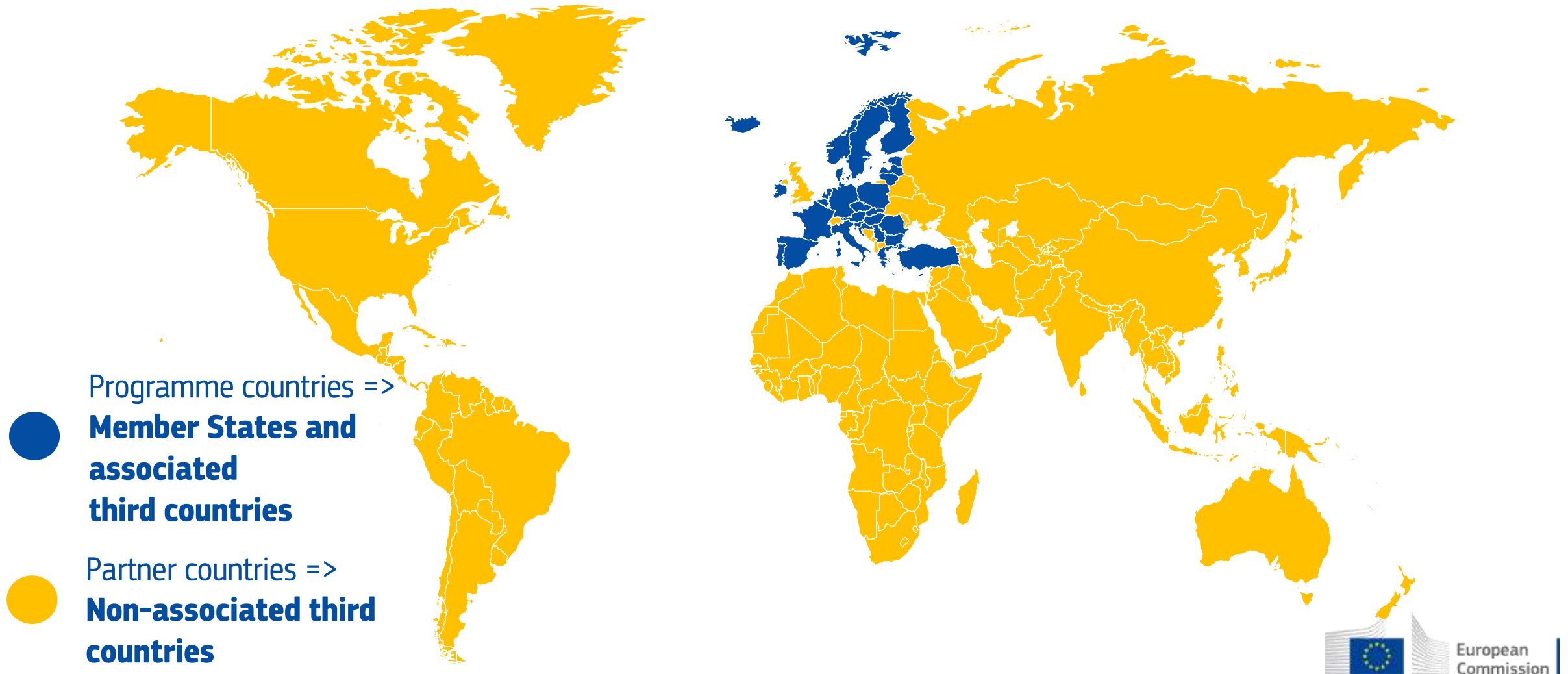

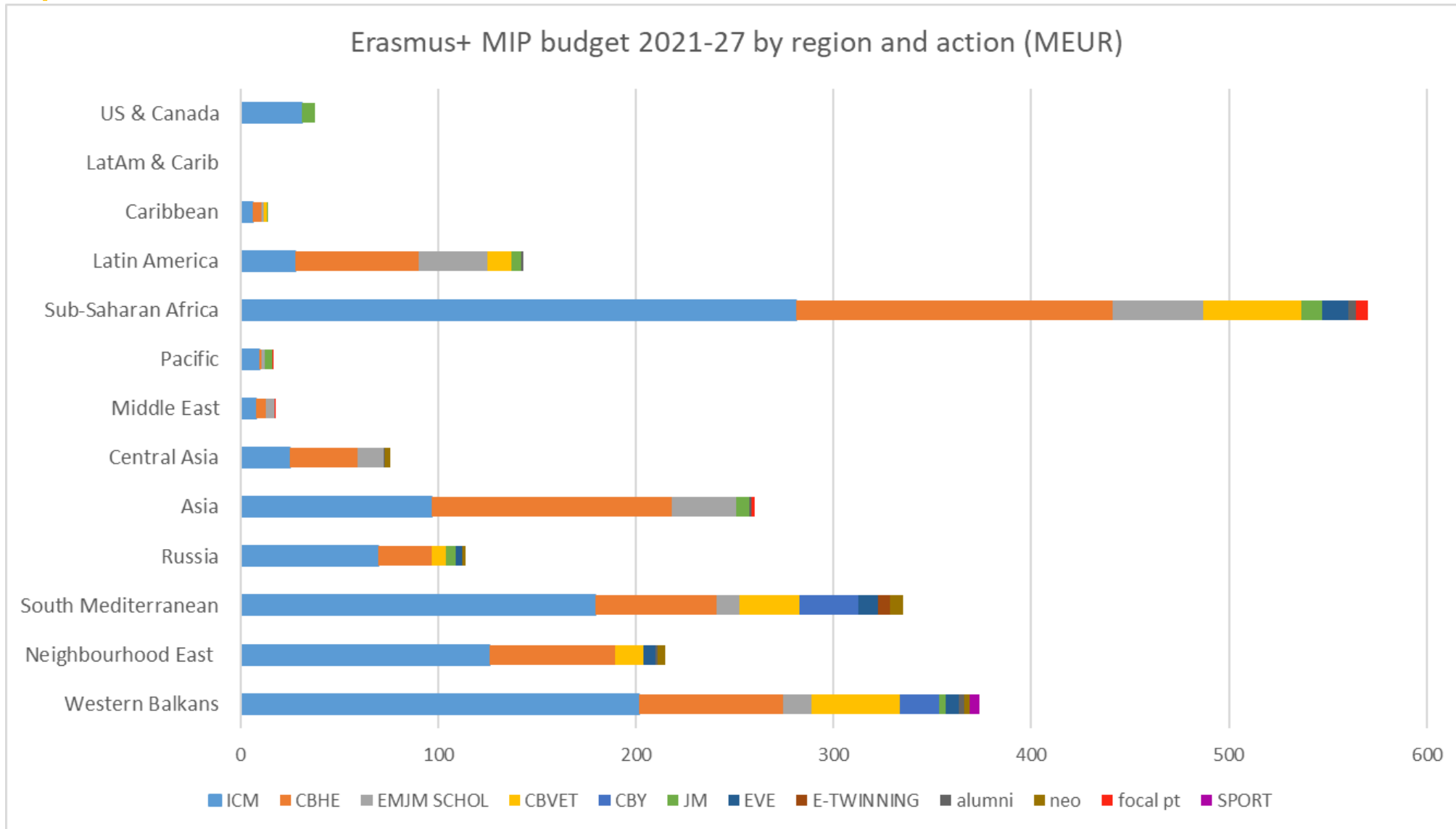
International dimension of Erasmus+ 2021-2027

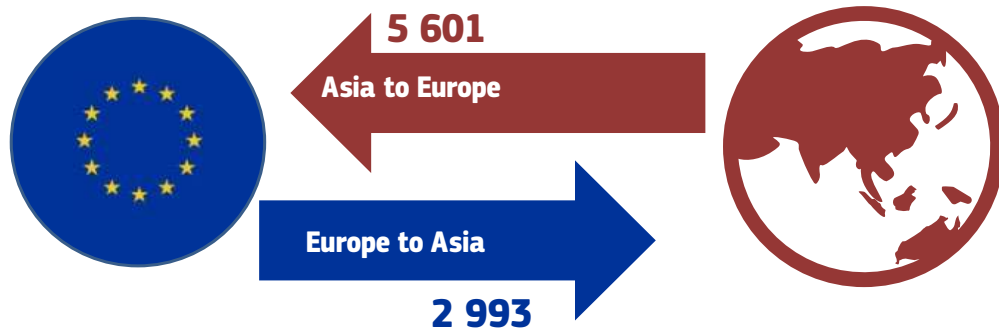


International credit mobility

ICM 2022 & 2023 - mobility for 100,000pp

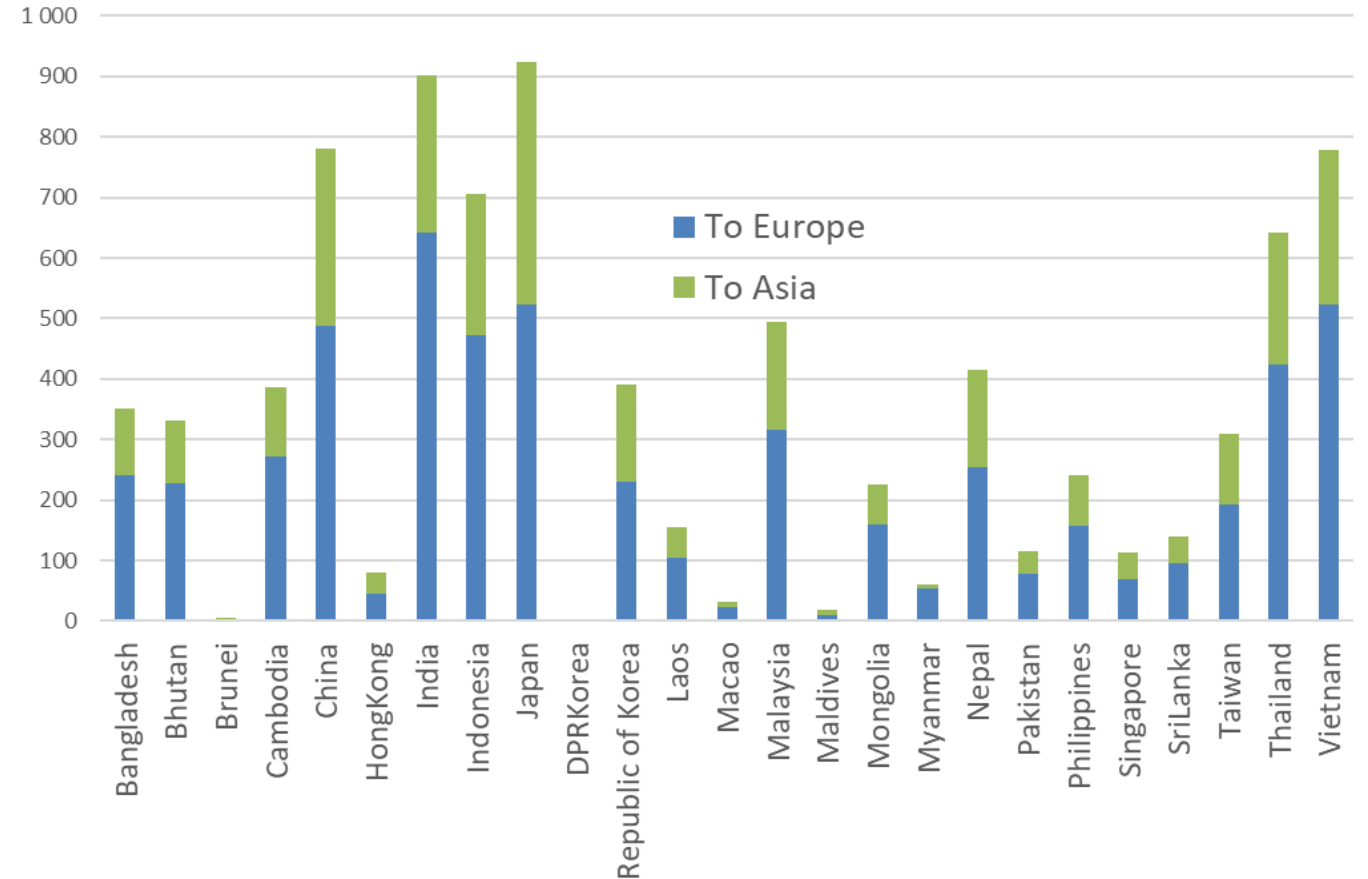

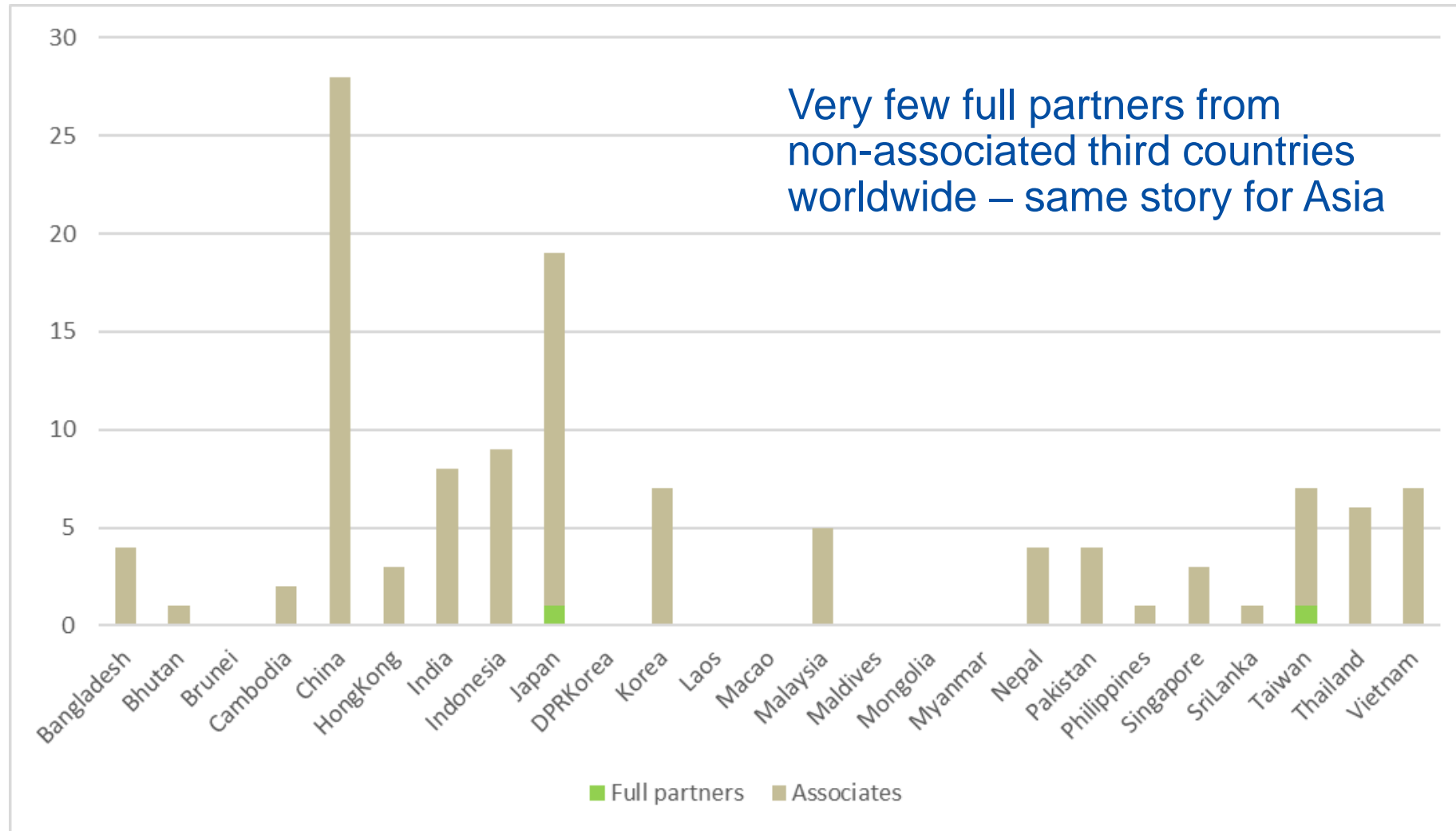

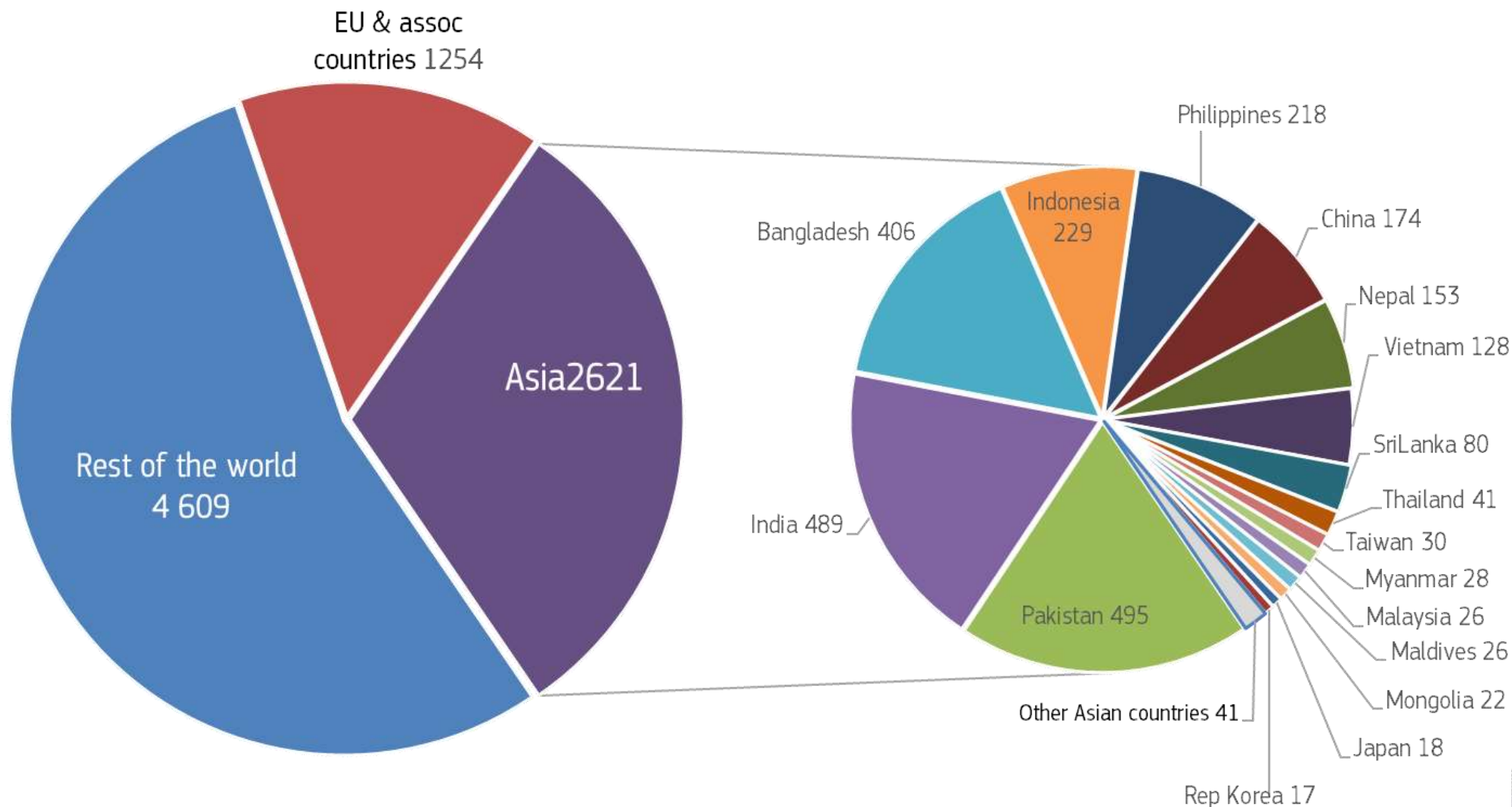
