




# Central Asia - CBHE results per country

### Some of the main past challenges

- Lack of synergies between different CBHE projects (and with other funded Erasmus+ initiatives) within the same institution
- Insufficient involvement of decision-makers and national authorities (especially for Structural Projects) in many projects
- Lack of students involvement
- Sustainability of project results often not sufficiently addressed by the consortia due to low project ownership by project partners
- Further involvement of non-academic partners



#### Some of the main past challenges

- Accreditation can take a long time and does not allow the running of degree programmes within the eligibility period of the CBHE project
- Delays in the acquisition of the equipment
- Increase in the price of travel tickets
- Problems with the obtention of visas
- External difficulties: E.g. Covid-19, political instability
- Low commitment at institutional level



#### Some of the main challenges ahead

- New rules: E-grants, Sygma, FTOP, lump sum II
- High turnover of staff
- Legal changes having an impact on project's implementation
