




CBHE 2022 & 2023 - Number of selected projects






CBHE 2022 & 2023 - % of overarching priorities




CBHE 2023 no of projects/priority




CBHE 2023 - Top Coordinator countries

- Some countries are still less represented (i.e. in Sub-Saharan Africa)
- Increase participation for Pacific and Caribbean
- We will continue focusing on least developed countries (LDCs) in Asia and Latin America
- Challenging landscape for certain CBHE projects in politically unstable countries
