#### Chile: Infrastructure



Seven Hospitals with combined budget of over US\$1bn in 2021. Two major, two medium and the rest small. PPP model



Line 7: Tenders expected shortly for project management and detailed engineering. Looking for TBM experience. Lines 8, 9 & 10 to follow along with two extensions to existing lines. Three tenders expected with total value of US\$540m



Bio Bio Rail Bridge: Expected value US\$ 150m. Looking at construction solutions (piles) and project management.





Two new railway lines: Santiago – Melipilla and Santiago – Batuco. Divided into multiple contracts – programme management required to bring everything together



Other projects in coming years including trams, expansions to regional airports, port modernisations, and extensive water infrastructure – consideration being given to water super-highway to move water from south to arid north.

#### Chile – Latest Economic Situation



- GDP rebounded strongly in second half of 2020
- Central Bank forecast 2021 GDP 5.5-6.5%
- Services Sector lags behind production
- > 1 million returned to work since July 2020
- Inflation below target 3% during 2021
- Copper price > \$4/lb stronger peso
- Exports recovered to pre-pandemic levels
- Pension reform and payouts
- New constitution and elections





## Doing Business in Chile



- Who you know and good contacts are key do your research!
- Dominated by "old money" emerging "factory office" culture.
- Business is formal and traditional Senior management take the decisions and do not like to be rushed.
- Modern Outlook open to new ideas and cutting-edge technology
