The CULTOUR project aims to develop sustainable tourism in the Black Sea Basin through cross-border cooperation. Focussing on cross-border business opportunities in the tourism sector, CULTOUR emphasises the cultural segment of the market within the Black Sea Basin - especially of its five partner countries – and the cultural heritage within them which provides the perfect basis for sustainable tourism.

The project is developing 15 jointly developed cross-border tourism routes, each involving between 2-5 countries, as well as 5 regional tourism routes, one in each partner country. Cultural and historical sites in Bulgaria, Ukraine and Turkey also received minor improvements in the hope of improving their attractiveness.

The project created a network of partners and stakeholders to facilitate these objectives and brought together leading municipalities, socio-economic and environmental NGO's, tourism organisations, policy design and decisions makers on national, regional and cross-border levels.
