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The Aim for COP26

- COP26 must unite the world on a path to a zero carbon economy as we build back better from COVID-19. We are at a turning point for our planet and our health.
- Despite the many challenges of COVID-19, the **international community must come together to reach agreement at COP26**. An agreement that accelerates action to reduce emissions, strengthens adaptation and resilience to impacts, scales up support and finance, protects and restores nature, and empowers inclusive action.
- In terms of the UNFCCC Negotiations, That means finalising the Paris Rulebook, concluding issues left over from Madrid
 and delivering on the essential negotiating items for 2020 and 2021.
- At Glasgow we must show that clean, low-carbon growth is the growth story of the future, that it is accelerating and is irreversible. Our path to a zero carbon economy must be fair and inclusive and create the global resilience we need to combat climate change.





What is Race to Zero?

The UN-backed, **global campaign** to **rally leadership and support** from all non-state actors for a **healthy**, **resilient**, **zero carbon recovery**.

All members are committed to the same overarching goal: halving emissions by 2030 and achieving **net zero emissions by 2050** at the very latest.

Led by the High-Level Climate Champions for Climate Action, Race to Zero mobilizes actors outside of national governments to join the <u>Climate</u> <u>Ambition Alliance</u>.

Who's in the Race?

The objective is to **build momentum** around the shift to a decarbonized economy ahead of COP26. This will send governments **a resounding signal** that business, cities, regions and investors are **united** in meeting the Paris goals and creating a more **inclusive and resilient economy**.

EXPONENTIAL ROADMAP Initiative

Race to Zero meta-criteria

1. PLEDGE

Pledge at the head-oforganization level to reach (net)-zero as soon as possible.

2. PLAN

Within 12 months of joining, set an interim target representing your fair share of 50% reduction by 2030.

3. PROCEED

Take immediate,
meaningful action toward
achieving net zero within
the first 12 months of
joining.

4. PUBLISH

Report progress annually by publishing against your targets on a public platform..

ALL SCOPES

Targets must cover all GHG emissions:


- 1. Including Scope 3 for businesses and investors
- 2. Including all territorial emissions for cities and regions

RESIDUAL EMISSIONS

- Offsets are not included in the calculation of emissions reduction
- 2. Any neutralization of residual emissions must transition to permanent, like-for-like removals.
- Encourage immediate contributions to the preservation and restoration of natural sinks.

LEADERSHIP PRINCIPLES

Seek to enable all actors to contribute to the global transition toward net zero through engagement, information sharing, access to finance, and capacity building. Develop pledges, plans, and actions in consideration of equity, drawing on, inter alia, the Sustainable Development Goals and Articles 2 and 4 of the Paris Agreement.





RIGHT IN THE BREAKTHROUGHS

RACE TO ZERO BREAKTHROUGHS

- To win the race to zero emissions by 2050 at the very latest, the world must achieve near-term breakthroughs across every sector of the global economy
- The Race to Zero Breakthroughs set out the specific, near-term tipping points for more than 20 sectors that make up the global economy, forming a master plan around which business, governments, and civil society can unite ahead of COP26
- To meet this challenge, actors covering 20% of their sector are being asked to commit to each breakthrough
- The HLCs sector work focuses on aligning and convening key actors in each sector around a shared climate action pathway
- Our goal this year is to achieve tipping points defined as actors covering 20% of their sector committing to each breakthrough - in at least ten sectors

- Climate Action Pathways: The Race to Zero Breakthroughs have been drawn from the Climate Action Pathways, a set of comprehensive roadmaps to achieve the Paris Agreement in line with 1.5°C across all sectors, which were developed by the Marrakech Partnership a vast coalition from across the climate action ecosystem all of whom will need to play their part to transform their sector to deliver the Breakthroughs
- Mission Possible Partnership: The MPP a key member of the coalition that includes the WEF, the Energy Transitions Commission, the Rocky Mountain Institute and We Mean Business – will help deliver the Race to Zero Breakthroughs in seven of the most energyintensive industries, including steel and shipping.

What is Race to Resilience?

A global campaign - the sibling to Race to Zero - catalysing a step-change in global ambition for climate resilience, putting people and nature first in pursuit of a resilient world where we don't just survive climate shocks and stresses but thrive in spite of them.

Goals

- By 2030, to catalyse action by non-state actors that builds the resilience of 4 billion people from groups and communities who are vulnerable to climate risks
- By 2050, to live in a world where all communities thrive in the face of the multiple risks and uncertainty posed by climate change
