



PROTECTION OF YOUR PERSONAL DATA

This privacy statement provides information about the processing and the protection of your personal data.

Processing operation: The EU-Africa Business Forum: High Level Green Talk on Green Energy Transition on 16 April and Digital Marketplace on 20-21 April

Data Controller: European Commission, Directorate-General for International Partnerships (DG INTPA), Units E2 and A1

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1. Introduction

The European Commission is committed to protect your personal data and to respect your privacy. The Commission collects and further processes personal data pursuant to Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data.

This privacy statement explains the reason for the processing of your personal data in the context of the EU-Africa Business Forum undertaken by Directorate-General for International Partnerships (DG INTPA). It explains the way we collect, handle and ensure protection of all personal data provided, how that information is used and what rights you have in relation to your personal data. It also specifies the contact details of the responsible Data Controller with whom you may exercise your rights, the Data Protection Officer and the European Data Protection Supervisor.

2. Why and how do we process your personal data?

Purpose of the processing operation Directorate-General for International Partnerships (DG INTPA) collects and further processes your personal data to provide you with information about the EU Africa Business Forum (before, during and after) and to process your application for participation in the EU-Africa Business Forum.

Live web-streaming and audio-visual recording of the speakers, organisers and participants, as well as photographs of the speakers and panoramic photographs of participants and organisers will be taken and published in the context of the EU-Africa Business Forum at the websites of the European Commission, the African Union and business organisations that are organising partners of the event, as well as on relevant social media channels.

The audience or non-speaker participants are not photographed individually or in groups. They may however appear on panoramic photographs of the whole event/audience.

Participants that do not wish to be part of the above web-streaming and recording/publishing activities have the possibility to object to processing. Participants can object to the possibility of processing by sending an email to the data controller prior to the event, explicitly specifying your request.

Your personal data will not be used for any automated decision-making including profiling.

3. On what legal ground(s) do we process your personal data?

The processing operations on personal data, linked to the organisation, management, follow-up and promotion of the EU-Africa Business Forum (including web-streaming, photos, audio-visual recording) are necessary for the management and functioning of the Commission, as mandated by the Treaties. Those provisions are in particular Article 11 of the Treaty on European Union and Article 15 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union. Consequently, those processing operations are lawful under Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 (processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Union institution or body).

Your consent is required for:

- the sharing of the EU-Africa Business Forum participants and exhibitors list containing your name and affiliation with other participants
- the sharing of the meeting/event attendee list containing your name and affiliation among participants and exhibitors, in order to create working groups to continue the collaborate work launched during the meeting/event;
- the processing of your personal data for inviting you to future events the data controller may organise;
- (optional) the audio and or visual recording of brief key moments from speakers, participants and exhibitors for the purpose of an approximately 2-minute long aftermovie, which will summarise the events of 16, 20 and 21 April, to be shared on the Commission's and partner business organisations' social media platforms, such as twitter.

If you opt-in, you are giving us your explicit consent under Article 5(1)(d) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 to process your personal data for those specific purposes. You can give your consent via a clear affirmative act by ticking the box(es) on the online registration form.

4. Which personal data do we collect and further process?

The following personal data will be processed:

- contact details (function/title, first name, last name, name of organisation, project to be exhibited at the market place (if applying), areas of interests, city, country, e-mail address, telephone number, (optional) profile picture);
- For exhibitors of the marketplace: email address, personal information, Skills, Biography,, Contact details, Organisation/Company, (optional) link to social media accounts
- For the recording of the 16 April event and aftermovie: audio-visual impressions, images of speakers, participants and exhibitors in panoramic shots to showcase the success of the events.

5. How long do we keep your personal data?

The Data Controller only keeps your personal data for the time necessary to fulfil the purpose of collection or further processing.

For each of the categories of personal data that is processed, please find below the retention details and the reference to the relevant record of processing

- All personal data related to the organisation and management of the EU-Africa Business Forum (this includes the information given during the registration, before, during or after the event) will be deleted **one year** after the last action in relation to the EU Africa Business Forum

- Recordings from the web-streamed EU Africa Business Forum will be kept for **2 years** before being deleted. More information is available in the Record of Processing DPR-EC-00306 (Web-streaming of Commission events).
- In case of audio-visual recording of the EU-Africa Business Forum the recordings will be kept for **1 year** after the EU-Africa Business Forum before being deleted. More information is available in the Record of Processing DPR-EC-01937 (Audio-visual recording of meetings).
- Personal data shared with the controller for future mailing purposes (e.g., for receiving newsletters or invitations to similar events) are processed in line with the Record of Processing (DPR-EC-03928.1 on Management of subscriptions to receive information).
- Selected service providers for organisational purposes (such as caterers, travel agents or event management organisations) are contractually bound to process personal data on behalf of and in line with the instructions of the data controller, keep confidential any data they process and protect it from unauthorised access, use and retention.

6. How do we protect and safeguard your personal data?

All personal data in electronic format (e-mails, documents, databases, uploaded batches of data, etc.) are stored either on the servers of the European Commission or of its contractors. All processing operations are carried out pursuant to Commission Decision (EU, Euratom) 2017/46 of 10 January 2017 on the security of communication and information systems in the European Commission.

The Commission's contractors are bound by a specific contractual clause for any processing operations of your personal data on behalf of the Commission, and by the confidentiality obligations deriving from the General Data Protection Regulation ('GDPR' - Regulation (EU) 2016/679)

In order to protect your personal data, the Commission has put in place a number of technical and organisational measures. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access, taking into consideration the risk presented by the processing and the nature of the personal data being processed. Organisational measures include restricting access to the personal data solely to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.

7. Who has access to your personal data and to whom is it disclosed?

Access to your personal data is provided to the Commission staff responsible for carrying out this processing operation and to other authorised Commission staff according to the "need to know" principle. Such staff abide by statutory, and when required, additional confidentiality agreements.

Where necessary, we may also share your information with our service provider for the purposes of organising the EU Africa Business Forum:

For communication purposes, i.e. to ensure that messages are shared on adequate online channels, some promotional material such as audio-visual recordings and snapshots of the speakers and panoramic view of the participants will be stored in a Google Drive, which is accessible to the organising partners of the EU-Africa Business Forum, the European

Commission and its delegations in Africa, the African Union, the Portuguese Presidency of the Council of the EU and the organising business partners.

8. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You have specific rights as a 'data subject' under Chapter III (Articles 14-25) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, in particular the right to access, your personal data and to rectify them in case your personal data are inaccurate or incomplete. Where applicable, you have the right to erase your personal data, to restrict the processing of your personal data, to object to the processing, and the right to data portability.

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data, which is lawfully carried out pursuant to Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 on grounds relating to your particular situation.

You have consented to provide your personal data to the data controller for some of the present processing operations mentioned above (see section 3.). You can withdraw your consent at any time by notifying the data controller *via email to EABF@downtowneuropa.be*. The withdrawal of your consent will not affect the lawfulness of the processing carried out before you have withdrawn the consent.

You can exercise your rights by contacting the data controller, or in case of conflict the Data Protection Officer. If necessary, you can also address the European Data Protection Supervisor. Their contact information is given under Heading 9 below.

Where you wish to exercise your rights in the context of one or several specific processing operations, please provide their description (i.e. their Record reference(s) as specified under Heading 10 below) in your request.
